The level of English your student needs to complete to meet the entry requirements for their preferred University or College will depend on the IELTS requirement for the course they want to study.

For courses requiring an:

- Overall IELTS of 5.5, students must complete AE3
- Overall IELTS of 6.0, students must complete AE4
- Overall IELTS of 6.5, students must complete AE5
